



Some members performed exceptionally well and, although subjective, due to the different formats and number of matches played, it should be noted that Paul Wilcox was the most successful. Stuart Armstrong in the away match at Test Valley scored a gross 75, very good going in a match format.

It should also be recognised that Geoff Eldred and Alan Christison both had a success rate of 65% playing 11 and 10 matches respectively.

The Match Secretary's role is difficult without a very good team of people behind you, with my thanks especially to members that are on a reserve list. My thanks to all those that volunteered to be reserves, they are very important and special thanks to Rod Rigby ever present as a player or reserve.

The Treasurer reported that everyone is invited to look at the accounts which are published on the Highwaymen website. There was also an invitation for members to question or comment in advance of the AGM.

With thanks to Bob Jarvis, the only question received, which is incorporated within his report.

With regard to this year's accounts and last year's accounts the effects of Covid have washed through so some level of "normality" has returned and therefore comparisons are valid.

Firstly, I would like to make comment about our reserve funds. Over the last 2 or 3 years the committee has questioned the need for the level of General Highwaymen's Funds. At the end of 2020 our General Funds stood at £2,473. Historically, when we had the precovid roll up system, the reserve was to cover the possibility of some major expenditure. In particular a new Highwaymen computer. Since Covid, the online booking system has negated the need for this, so the committee decided to set a reduced "target" level. This has been done in steps and the current target is £1,250 - which due to some last-minute costs before the accounts were finalised, I overshot by £11. This shortfall will be recovered from November roll up fees. At the target level of £1,250 this means that over the last three years the General Funds have been reduced by £1,234.

As a general comment the reduction of the General Funds has enabled us to maintain the £2 roll up fee and recover some of the VAT paid over to Customs & Excise in previous years.



The creation of the Club Captain's Charity and Staff Gratuity Funds in 2020 was specifically to avoid money going into General Funds before being paid out to the charities. By-passing



General Funds in this way avoids us paying VAT on those elements of the rollup receipts. At present both funds are well provisioned. Arguably the Staff Gratuity Fund looks to be on

the high side as historically we only paid the green staff a Christmas gratuity. However, the committee has decided to include the pro-shop staff as deserving of a gratuity. Also, the committee decided to "regularise" the payment of gratuities to the bar & kitchen staff. In the past our approach towards gratuities for bar & kitchen staff had been inconsistent and sometimes hidden within dinner costs. The committee has decided that an annual gratuity is the most relevant and transparent way to show our appreciation to those who have served us throughout the year. Accordingly, we will be paying out a total of £750 in gratuities from this fund before Christmas.

Looking at the accounts some exceptional items to report.

<u>Computer costs</u> have increased in part because the cost of our web domain name covers a 2-year subscription.

<u>Engraving costs</u> reflect a catch-up of prior years in respect of mixed trophies and also the late payment of some of the previous year's costs.

<u>Bank fees</u>. Our bankers, HSBC, reclassified our current account as a charity account (previously a community account) part way through last year. This "privilege" has resulted in a £5 per month bank fee. Last year there were only 10 months of charges – this year 12 months.

On the positive side interest rates receivable on the deposit account have steadily increased over the year which is reflected in a credit of £60 which happily cancels out the bank fees suffered.

Lastly a comment on the guests invited to the 2022 Christmas and 2023 Autumn dinners. Some years ago, the committee decided that guests at our dinners should be funded by the whole Highwaymen section, not just the diners on the day. This year we had 7 guests for the Christmas Dinner at a cost of £294. In 2021 we had 5 guests at a cost of £200. Also, this year the Club Captain was a guest at the Autumn Dinner. These costs are included under Special Events in the accounts.
