When I started playing golf a few years ago, I saw that the Highwaymen have great experience in three areas, one it is the serious competitions and trophy events which take place during the year, the second were the fun events where we get to go and play socially and enjoy the company, but the third were the team events, where we get to compete as a team on other courses around the region.

Interestingly, this year almost 10% of all the players who played for us at Highwaymen matches had never played inter-club matches and team events before, so it was an introduction for them.

The benefits I see are that we a chance to try new courses in a very structured and organised way, we can test ourselves competitively in a very friendly and relaxed way and get to meet other golfers in the region.

We also get a chance to share some of our experiences with other golfers around the region and it also enhances the club. internally and externally.


We have had 120 golfers from around the region who experienced the course during the summer and walked away with a bit of a wow factor, which is good for the reputation of the club. We also get a chance for the Highwaymen to play on 10 or 11 different courses, in a very competitive environment, and compare those courses with ours, and generally speaking, our course comes out very well.

This year provided three themes, one driven by process. Many of you are unaware that the match secretary has about 4,000 communication points during the year to deal with.

It works quite well, but we're always trying to improve on the efficiency, and effectiveness of that communication. To assist that, I've used emails and the website, but we're always working to try to pick up where things have gone wrong.

I'd like to mention the three amigos who have solved those problems when those hiccups happened this year, first, Emile who played like a titan or a giant of the golf field by taking on two players at Clandon Regis away and managing to get a half on his own, well done.

Second Andy Heath who actually goes to prove that you should sleep with pyjamas, which enabled him to jump in his car and come flying down at a moment's notice in the morning to fill a four ball at Test Valley, thank you. Third Robert Oxley who had dumped his children at breakfast, rushed off to fill in at our last game against Sutton Green. the only caveat is, he was the reason for the problem because he'd forgotten he was supposed to be playing that day.

The intention is to try and become more seamless and more predictable in future, our plan is to become organized and structured such that it becomes a very simple straightforward thing for you once you volunteer to play it will be a seamless and hopefully hassle-free experience.

There was a coach many years ago for the Green Bay Packers in America, who said that winning isn't everything, it is the only thing, but to that we do not subscribe, as mentioned before it's about providing a competitive relaxed and organized environment for people to play and enjoy team golf.

We again have managed to achieve good solid results bearing in mind we picked players to ensure that everybody gets a fair chance if they are interested in playing team golf. In that respect we've done very well, and we just maintained, for another year, the Fortress Windlesham with having not lost at home.

We continue to present Windlesham Golf Course as a fine example of the region, but it's a difficult course to play on. And almost everybody tells me that whenever the opportunity comes up for the other clubs to come and play with us, they are always oversubscribed, which is a testament to the course and the club we're organising. You will note, there is no lost column for the home matches.

Before I give a very quick update on Treasury matters, I did want to thank Howard Somerville, the previous Treasurer, for all his wise counsel over the year, much appreciated Howard, and John Burton who's given up his time once again to audit our accounts. Thank you to both of you.

Coming on to the finances of the year ending 31st October, the accounts, John kindly audited, have been posted on the website, not for that long but hopefully some of you have had the opportunity to look at them if you're so inclined.

The committee had agreed throughout this year to maintain retained Highwaymen funds at around £1,250, we overshot that slightly, and ended the year just above that by £81, at £1,331.

That excludes a few items that I'm going to come on to because many of you will know, but for those that don't, we received the very unexpected, but nonetheless very welcome, very generous, donation from Brough Girling, who passed away the previous year, from his estate, a legacy to the Highwaymen section.

The committee have decided to use the legacy in the following three ways so far. First, to plant a tree in Brough's honour on the course with a commemorative plaque. There will be more details to follow.


Secondly, we've decided that we are going to fund some CPR training for number of Highwaymen, I think it happens next week, and there may be people in the audience that are attending that, so that's going to be funded by the Highwaymen thanks to Brough's donation.

Thirdly, we are going to buy two new trophies, two new Order of Merit trophies, one of which will be the Winter Nine-hole Order of Merit, which will be named the Girling Order of Merit trophy.

I hope you agree that's three worthy things to fund from the donation.

Throughout the year we've ensured that we've made adequate provisions to fund the club captain's charity for next year and indeed future years.

We have also ensured that we have enough money to properly thank, through gratuities, all the staff that support us here throughout the year.



Treasurer's report – Andrew Harvey



The above is a three-year snapshot and those of you with a longer history than me will know that the HWM funds were once upon a time at a much higher level, but things are a lot simpler now. We don't need to retain that much money, so we have deliberately reduced that. The £ 700 (green bar above) is our estimate of the three things we intend to spend out of the Brough Legacy.

The money that you pay, your exorbitant £2 every Thursday, some of that does indeed find its way to, first, the charity, last year Brightest Stars, £1,800. We also paid, just before last Christmas, £750 in gratuities to the greenkeeping staff, food and beverage, and a few people in the office.

With regard prize money, You may not be aware that in total we paid out more than £3,000 in prizes. It was very well distributed. With 97 players receiving a financial prize. An increase on the previous year in terms of the percentage of our income to around about 54%.
