

Competition Notes

Pairs Stableford Competition – 22 October 2020

- Entries are now open in “Future Competitions” and close at 3pm on Monday 19 October. Thereafter, if there are slots still available, you can join the competition by contacting the Proshop. The pairings and tee times will be selected at random.
- **If you have to cancel before entries close at 3pm on a Monday, please withdraw your entry in Future Competitions. If you have to withdraw after entries have closed, please contact the Proshop direct, please do not cancel your allocated tee time online or contact Keith or Bill. The Proshop will try and maintain pairings as far as possible.**
- You should receive an email from the Proshop confirming your partner and tee time. So please check that you are set up to receive them. For the avoidance of doubt, players in columns 1 and 2 play together as do players in columns 3 and 4.
- The competition is played off the yellow tees, with full CONGU handicap, and the best score per hole counts. One card per pair, individual scores are not required. The winners are the pair with the most stableford points over 18 holes.
- The entry fee is £2 and will be deducted from loyalty cards on or shortly after the day of the competition. £1 goes to the prize fund and the majority of the remainder to the Captain’s Charity.
- The “Return to Golf” policy and current social distancing rules should be applied at all times, including all local rules arising from the Covid-19 pandemic. The Club’s “How to guide – competitions” also applies. In simple terms, each pair marks their own card, keeps a note of the score of the other pair and checks it at the end of the round - without switching or handling cards other than their own.
- All players are responsible for maintaining a good pace of play so as not to unduly delay fellow HWM and other Club members. As it is a stableford competition, please do not waste time completing a hole if you have no chance of scoring. If you are losing position behind the group in front of you, please allow faster groups to play through. Ready golf speeds up the game.
- Players should “sign in” with the Proshop before playing.
- If you can, please enter your score online as set out in the “How to” guide. Ideally, this should be done in or around the clubhouse from your smartphone or tablet. For those that do not have a smartphone available, you can take a copy of your score and enter the shots you have taken online as soon as you get back home. Only if you cannot do that, you can hand in your card at the Proshop and they will enter it as and when they have time.
- ALL cards should be handed into the Proshop before you leave the Club, irrespective of how the scores are to be entered.
