It had, in its way, the tincture of history about it—men assembling, as they have always assembled, to measure themselves against one another. A match, yes, but in the minds of its witnesses something older stirred, a resonance that reached back even to Agincourt, that gallery of remembered glories. The Highwaymen triumphed without qualm or apology, 5 - 1, their manner precise, almost clinical: drives set down like declarations, putts struck with the finality of verdicts. Their laughter, their needling jests, spread like a contagion, uncontainable. And yet across from them, diminished by the absence of their knight-Berkeley, who was legend and presence both-the Tuesday Gang persisted, but only in attempt. There was gallantry in that persistence, brief resistance even, what one saw of it in the sixth group, success. It was not enough, and never could be. After, though, the field altered its temper. Victory and defeat, temporary masks, were lifted away. The men were comrades again, sitting with the day's labour behind them, drinking, exchanging murmured ironies, vowing in low tones to return, to make of training a redemption. If tomorrow was uncertain, Colonel Mucklow at least awaited in promise, as all such trials must, to make a better man on the battlefield.
